Board Chair & Executive Director Message

Dear friends,

This past year has felt like a new chapter beginning at Merrymount.

As we move forward from the pandemic and reflect on the past three years, our team keeps returning to the **importance of community**. It's the relationships we have missed the most and we are excited about rebuilding these.

This renewed commitment to community is woven into many of our updates from this year – whether the community of children and families we serve, the community of donors and volunteers who provide critical support, or the greater London area community where Merrymount has been operating for almost 150 years.

With the help of the organization, Merrymount Senior Leadership and the Board of Directors undertook the **Strategic Planning** process this year to develop a framework to guide Merrymount from 2023- 2026 (detailed on page 4 of this Annual Report). Throughout this Strategic Plan, you'll see the importance of community within the three pillars. People - the relationships with staff, volunteers, clients, and the community at large - form the basis for how we define success. We're excited to implement this Strategic Plan, strengthen relationships with those inside and outside the walls of Merrymount, and to guide this organization through pandemic recovery and through our 150th anniversary.

As we begin this new chapter in Merrymount's history, we drafted new **Mission, Vision, and Values** statements to ensure they accurately reflect the work being done today. Our new identity statements focus our organization's priorities on what we do best: supporting children and families going through difficult challenges, whether relating to mental health, separation and custody disputes, children with special needs, or families in emergency crisis situations. These new identity

statements emphasize our professionalism and experience as an accredited children's mental health centre and renew our commitment to providing effective and responsive programs and services to those in need.

Recently, our **Crisis Residential/Respite Program** (CR/RP) returned to full capacity after several years of limited operations due to COVID-19. With all 18 beds now operating nightly, we can reach more children experiencing mental health challenges, or in need of care due to a crisis, as well as their families. In addition to operating at full capacity, CR/RP is now responding to crisis calls, admitting children into care 24/7. Individualized plans of care now have more flexibility in terms of their length of stay at Merrymount, which means our program can be tailored to best support their specific circumstances and needs. This responsiveness and flexibility of family support is the foundation upon which Merrymount was built, and we're thrilled to offer this vital program once again as it was intended to operate.

Reviving community relationships also means opening our doors to supporters and friends of Merrymount once again. This year, we welcomed community members back to the Merrymount building for tours and meetings, allowing for a greater understanding of the scope of the work being done at Merrymount. We invite you to schedule a time to visit us in the coming weeks and months, so you can see for yourself the important work done daily by our wonderful staff team.

As you read through this Annual Report, we hope you can share in our excitement and optimism as we work together to move past the pandemic, and into a future where all children and families have the capacity, resources and support needed to face their challenges.

Thank you for your continued support, compassion, and hope for a better tomorrow.

Harry Potter and friends at Hogwarts welcomed some new classmates this year, straight from Merrymount!

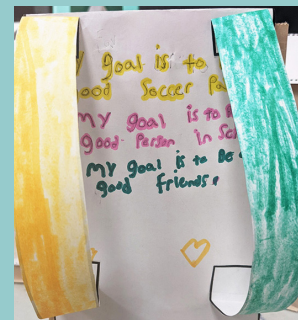

Program Highlights

Intake Department

The Intake team has had another busy year working closely with families to identify and facilitate access to programs and services. We have continued to meet virtually with parents and caregivers, but are happy to now be able to meet in-person at the Merrymount building once again. For both caregivers and children, it provides peace of mind to be able to see the building and where children will stay while accessing services.

The Service Coordination team is also offering in-person meetings to families. Individualization of services and meeting families at their point of need is central to the Service Coordination model; offering either virtual or in-person meetings is yet another way to ensure families and children have access to the support that will work best for them, depending on their specific circumstances.

Parenting and Children's Groups

Our Children's Groups celebrated the return of in-person meetings this year, with pandemic restrictions beginning to lift at Merrymount. For children between 4 - 12 years of age, in-person programs allow for greater connections to be formed and for increased program efficiency. Run by licensed Art Therapists, the children's group programs incorporate many techniques to build resilience and self-esteem.

The Parenting Groups continue to be run virtually, with our participants indicating this delivery method offers more flexibility and accessibility to service. Parents are better able to schedule time to attend sessions, feel more comfortable sharing in the meetings, and no longer have to take childcare into consideration when attending.

Some of our Parenting and Children's Groups are run concurrently, meaning parents are given the tools to support and guide their children as they attend their own group sessions. This helps strengthen the whole family unit, bringing caregivers and children closer as they learn to navigate challenges together.

Crisis Residential/Respite Program

Merrymount's Crisis Residential/Respite Program (CR/RP) supports children 12 and under, and their families, experiencing challenges related to children's mental health needs. The work being done by this vital program is needed now more than ever to support a community struggling after years of pandemic restrictions, rising cost of living, and deteriorating mental well-being.

This year, CR/RP reopened to full capacity after a few years of limited operations due to COVID-19. All 18 overnight beds are now available for children and families in need of support due to children's mental health needs that are impacting the child's ability to function at home, school or in the community. That's up to 6,570 nights of care available each year for those in need!

With the easing of pandemic restrictions, we are once again able to provide care for children whose families are experiencing an emergency or crisis. In these instances, children can be admitted to CR/RP around the clock, and we can offer flexibility in terms of length of stay to meet individual families' specific needs.

In addition to the 18 overnight spaces, CR/RP offers flexible scheduling for children and families who do not require overnight hours.

The focus for the program is to provide a therapeutic environment that enables children to develop capacity and build skills in mindfulness, resiliency, coping strategies, life and social skills, conflict resolution, problem solving, emotion regulation, etc.

Stronger children, stronger families, stronger community.

Inclusion Support Services

Congratulations on 25 years supporting the childcare and early years sector!

This year marks the 25th anniversary of the All Kids Belong program at Merrymount!

All Kids Belongs had another successful year operating in the London-Middlesex and St. Thomas-Elgin communities. Our Resource Consultants and Enhancement Facilitator have been busy supporting the inclusion of children with special needs in licensed child care centres, licensed home child care, EarlyON Child and Family Centres, before and after school programs, children's camps, and authorized recreational and skill building programs at no additional cost to parents/guardians.

When the AKB program first began in 1998, we supported 214 children in London-Middlesex; in 2022, we supported 707! We began supporting the St. Thomas-Elgin area in 2006 and have seen significant growth in that area as well.

At present, we are serving over 240 sites across London-Middlesex and St. Thomas-Elgin.

Not only are our staff providing in-person support to the centres mentioned above, but our online resource library and online courses remain popular destinations for community early childhood educators looking for additional support. We plan to continue to make use of our online platforms to provide information to the community in flexible and responsive ways.

Families and Infants Together

The FIT program welcomed a full return to in-person services this year. Our dedicated staff continue to work with community partners to provide service coordination and a wide variety of supports to families and infants with high and complex needs to help these families remain together.



Pandemic-related stressors, the rising cost of food, and lack of affordable housing continue to make life challenging, and we are proud to work alongside these resilient families.

Mutual Aid Parenting Program and Community Action Program for Children

MAPP continues to be a busy and popular program, operating ongoing parenting peer support groups at multiple community sites throughout London and Middlesex County. This year we resumed in-person meetings, with only one group continuing virtually. Our members continue to inspire us with their enthusiastic participation in the program, bringing their unique experiences, successes, and challenges to each meeting where our facilitators provide support, information, and resources.

CAPC has also had another busy year, providing short-term programs focused on nutrition, health, child development, safety and more.

Together we learn, grow, and make life better for families.

Supervised Access Program

The Supervised Access Program provides a safe, non-threatening, child-focused, neutral environment for families who are experiencing a high-conflict separation and are having difficulties making decisions around parenting time arrangements. Supervised Parenting Time provides an opportunity for non-residential parents to spend time with their children, fully supervised by Staff trained to encourage positive parent-child interactions. Supervised Exchanges provide a safe transfer of children between parents for off-site parenting time. The exchange transfers are facilitated by trained Staff and help ease tensions of parenting time arrangements for children and parents, eliminating direct contact between parents, and reducing opportunities for children to be subjected to conflict.

With the easing of pandemic restrictions, we are once again able to facilitate two-hour in-person Supervised Parenting Time sessions in London-Middlesex, St. Thomas-Elgin, and Woodstock-Oxford Counties. Along with in-person services, the St. Thomas-Elgin and Woodstock-Oxford locations continue to provide virtual parenting time options. We are working closer to operating at full capacity to meet the increasing need in our communities.



Thames Valley Alternative Secondary School (community partner)

This is the eighth year I've had the pleasure of teaching the Alt. Ed. program at Merrymount. Our program's EA, Wendy Link, and I were happy to see our student population increase dramatically since experiencing a decline during the pandemic. At this time last year, we only had two students; presently, we have eleven. On occasion we've even had overflow students working in the hall outside our classroom.

Merrymount has continued to provide our students with daily childcare spaces, supporting them as moms while working towards their OSSD. Students have also been provided with nourishing lunches, lovingly created by Merrymount's kitchen staff. We are exploring the option of offering Merrymount's parenting programs to our students in the coming school year.

The students all respond positively to the safe and nurturing learning environment at Merrymount, created in great part by the caring and supportive Merrymount staff. We have had many students express an interest in returning in the fall, and Wendy and I look forward to the 2023-2024 school year.

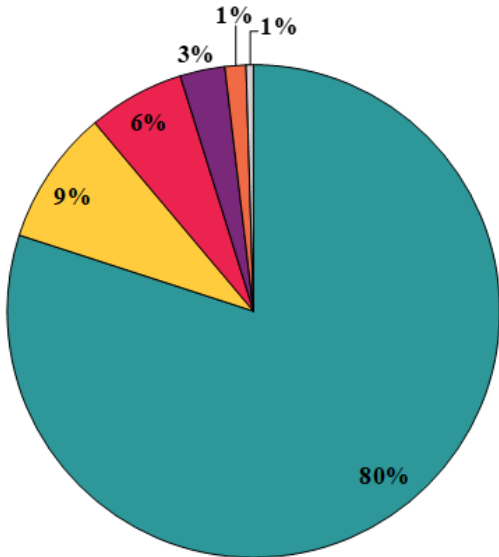

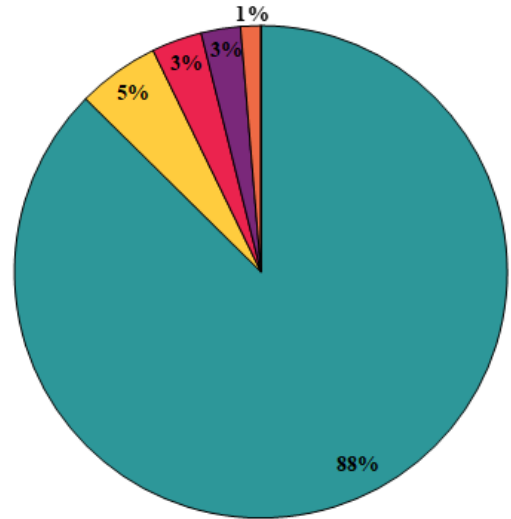
